➤ **LANGUAGE AND SKILLS****Unit 7 Simply the best DESCRIBING PLACES - my favourite town/the town I live in**

- *What's Berlin like? What are the people like? What's the nightlife like?, comparatives and superlatives, sentence patterns "the more the better...."; "it's getting more and more difficult"; synonyms (nice/lovely) and antonyms (amazing≠awful).*
- *What's on? Talking about venues in town, relative pronouns which, where, who, that; written production: describing my hometown.*

Unit 8 Living dangerously TALKING ABOUT DANGEROUS SPORTS AND LIFE STYLES

- Describing a dangerous sport (*skydiving, motorcar racing, big wave surfing, ...*): the activity, equipment and clothes, places where to practise, training and fitness, etc.
- *Must, have to* for obligation; *can/can't* for possibility, *should/shouldn't* for giving advice, *must/mustn't* for strong advice.
- Talking about health and fitness: at the doctor's : *I've got a sore throat, an allergy,, You should rest for a couple of days,*

Unit 9 What a story! STORYTELLING

- Past Perfect; Past Perfect vs Past Simple
- Basic linkers: *however, although, so, while, because*; Time linkers: *when, while, after, as, until, as soon as*.
- Feelings: *amazed, delighted, upset, disappointed,*
- Exclamations with *so* and *such*

Unit 10 All-time greats! TALKING ABOUT SPORTS TEAMS

- Describing a popular sports team: foundation, players, ground/pitch, trophies, dark period, rival, anthem, colours, nickname, players' diet, salary, risks, sacrifices,
- Talking about inventions that changed the world: the passive – all tenses + modals;
- Everyday English: on the phone
- Phrasal verbs to describe daily routine: *take off, put on, turn off/on, get on/ off the train, fit in, squeeze in,* (video on Classroom)
- Discussing the benefits and drawbacks of social media sites using phrases such as *"to be honest, as far as I'm concerned, I reckon/guess/feel, I couldn't agree more, think highly of s.one,"*
